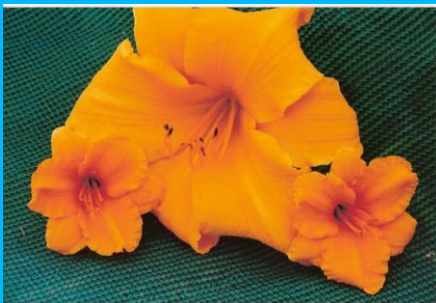


## *Hemerocallis* ‘Little Gold Nugget’

*Bright clear-gold flowers ♦ Long blooming period ♦ Tolerant of most soils ♦ Near compact bloomer*



‘Little Gold Nugget’ (Herrington, Tim 2005) is a dormant diploid with a small 2.8" bloom held 12" high. Its initial blooms are mid-season. This reblooming flower is a brilliant gold self above a tiny green throat that makes an aesthetically pleasing border plant with its 22 buds and 5 way branching. Even at day’s end, you will enjoy looking at ‘Little Gold Nugget’ as the sun is about to set in the West. The color is like an “electric bright gold” that makes everything around it just disappear to your eyes. This daylily has the character to be a perfect example of a miniature with its pleasing relationship between the foliage and the placement of branches, buds, and flowers which creates a naturally symmetrical form. It is fertile both ways and won the coveted AHS Achievement Medal in 2005. It won an A.M. and the Florida Sunshine Cup in 2017.



Here you see 2 blooms of ‘Little Gold Nugget’ next to ‘Mary’s Gold’ which demonstrates the bright clear-gold color. ‘Mary’s Gold’ is the very popular 6.5" tetraploid which is a blindingly bright gold self hybridized by our friend and fellow daylily connoisseur Harold McDonell of Fayetteville, Georgia. ‘Little Gold Nugget’ has amazing flower power, is a breakthrough in miniatures and has become an All-American Daylily. ‘Little Gold Nugget’ represents a milestone in breeding and is ideal for any display garden to exhibit a miniature

which can educate visitors about modern daylilies and how they can be used effectively in landscapes. This flower is absolutely resistant to daylily rust and thrives and blooms in full sun and light shade. ‘Little Gold Nugget’ offers purity of color, vigorous growth, multiple bloom periods and wide adaptability ensuring it a spot in gardens from Macon, Georgia to Mayville, Michigan to Nova Scotia. Also this flower is a nice choice to enter in the miniature section of an AHS accredited flower show. It has won Best Miniature in 14 daylily shows throughout America so far and one Best In Show. Pictured to the right is my friend Walter Wall with his Best Miniature entry. We are very proud that this daylily is a candidate for the Stout Medal in 2018 which is very rare for a miniature to go this far in the AHS 'Pyramid of Awards'.
